Curtin Liaison Report

Curtin University Hockey Club continued our strong affiliation with Curtin University and Curtin Stadium. There was ongoing strong collaboration with our friendly partners in Curtin Football Club and Curtin Rugby Club in sharing of the clubroom facilities and the training fields during the week. We also had continued discussions with Curtin Stadium about increasing our presence on campus and working towards developing a more permanent home-base for the club at Curtin. The surface of the grass field at Edinburgh South continues to improve noticeably on previous years, and credit must go to the team at Curtin Stadium who managed to coordinate regular maintenance on the fields.

Through the tireless efforts of many student volunteers, we were able to engage with new club members through on campus events for 'O' Day for both Semester 1 and 2, as well as providing a stall at the inaugural Vice Chancellors Sports Carnival. I would like to thank Jacob Nenke, Ellie Grover, Tim Adams, Lauren Cook, Amy Woodfield, Bec Revill, Janice Stevens, and Katie Flanagan for their support in running the activity for the VC Sports Carnival.

We also continued to provide coaches for the "Carnaby kids" program, and strengthen our relationship with the University and Curtin Stadium through social media promotion. As we have in previous years, the university entered a hockey team in "Uni games" which included many players from rival clubs playing in the orange and white, something which is encouraging to see for the connection between CUHC and Curtin University. We also have 4 teams representing the university and the hockey club in the social summer hockey competition, and we are continually looking to expand this number.

We are also in ongoing talks with the Curtin Football and Rugby Club around accessing Government funding for upgrades to the facilities at Curtin, including lighting and shelter for the Edinburgh South field. Whilst this may be tricky with the tightening of the University's budget given the financial crisis caused by COVID, we are still hopeful to have something in the works in the not too distant future.

Last but certainly not least, we had an extremely successful night at the Curtin Sports Awards for season 2021. Award winners and nominations were as follows:

- Kaitlin Nobbs was awarded the "Elite Athlete of the Year - Female" for her outstanding performance representing the Hockeyroos at the Tokyo Olympics;
- Amy Woodfield was awarded the "Volunteer of the Year" For her tireless efforts with the club's junior program as well as her continued contribution to University sport;
- There were no less than 5 players awarded "Curtin Colours" (Adam Piggott, Tony Ziegelaar, Rhys Brnich, Jacob Nenke, Katie Flanagan);
- The Club was nominated for the "Sports club excellence award", unfortunately missing out on the prize to Curtin Wesley Australian Rules Football Club

All in all, 2021 was another successful year for building and maintaining our strong relationship with Curtin University and Curtin Stadium, and I look forward to continued growth in 2022!



Membership and Recruitment Director's Report

Last year we had 273 members with the pandemic reducing our members. We have increased our overall members for 2021 reaching 318 registrations with the club presumably just old members returning to play, as 2019 we had 315 members. There was a strong interest from students during the O-day for semester one with 42 expressions of interest however only 8 signed up. We also attended club day in semester 1 however there was only interest for University Games, none for attending the club. We did not attend O-day semester 2 as season is nearly over.

Seniors

As a club we are well-aware we need to grow our club in both sides but especially men's. To be attractive we need to keep our top squads.

We have proposed strategies during the year with the "Into the Future" presentation that was given and have tried to establish contacts via Peter Freer in WA and in other states. This has been ongoing but am yet to get a full rundown of possible interest in the club.

Key Points:

- **Finding Coaches**
 - We need to find committed coaches for next season for premier league men's as well as women's as a priority before getting more players
- **Use Curtin Affiliation more to advantage**
 - Tavern events good fundraiser as well as get the hockey name out there maybe try enticing students to watch actual games
 - Physiotherapy: Students are always looking to get experience for next season we need to use this resource; along with Exercise Physiologists at Curtin.
- **Indoor Competition**
 - Many of our players are indoor players over summer we could look at putting a team in or two like the other major clubs we can attract other players to play for us in actual season
 - This also could help with sponsors having more exposure time with the indoor season as well
- **Centralising recruitment team**
 - Pooling resources and making sure we know what we can and can't offer players
 - Avoids overwhelming people with multiple individuals trying to contact one person
 - This has been done over summer and draft recruitment documents have been made as a way of keeping track of offers and players
- Maybe pay for a Facebook ad during February (unsure of cost)

Juniors

Overall goal is to make juniors more exciting and so that the juniors and their parents recruit for us. By providing programs sponsored by Curtin also promotes our club and gets us juniors coming through the club with a real interest to stay with us for future years.

Junior's Coordinator's Review

Following an interesting year in 2020 thanks to COVID, we welcomed a regular season this year for our junior players. Most notably this year, we nominated our first J5/6 team in a number of years – a fantastic sign that our junior club is growing and becoming more sustainable.

We nominated 2 J11/12 girls teams this year, with our top side gaining a spot in the A Promotion division this year. It was a tough start for the A Promotion team as they adjusted to the stronger competition. Their hard work & determination paid off in the latter half of the season, finishing in 5th place overall. We also nominated a J11/12 B grade team who showed great development throughout the season and provides a key division for our 9/10's to transition into the older age group in the seasons to come. The J9/10's encompassed Year 7's, Year 8's & Year 9's from Mercedes College, this team were very new to the sport and showed great improvement throughout the year.

Our J5/6's played in the mixed C grade division and played with great enthusiasm every week, committed to training and learning to work to each other's strengths. Our Sub-junior sector is slowly growing, with 7 J3/4 (Grads) players and 5 Minkey players this year. All bringing great energy to CUHC every Saturday morning.

This year CUHC celebrated the 5th anniversary of our Summer Schools Program which paves the pathway for new players to experience the sport and ultimately translate to CUHC junior teams in the Winter season. Through the Summer School Program CUHC provide 8x hour long beginner hockey lessons before or after school on a day of the school's choosing. Each new player entering the program receives their own hockey stick, CUHC T-shirt, hockey ball & shin pads. We remain established in 5 schools, including Collier Primary School (Como), Curtin Primary School (Manning), St Columba's Catholic Primary School (South Perth), Regent College (Victoria Park) and Aubin Grove Primary (Aubin Grove). This year, we are expanding into 3 new schools, including High Wycombe Primary School (High Wycombe), Millen Primary School (East Victoria Park) and Parkwood Primary School (Parkwood).

Currently in Term 4, we are driving registrations into our Summer School Program through running Have A Go Days in the school's regular PE lessons. The Have A Go Days will provide a taster session of hockey with CUHC to approximately 1140 students across the metro area.

In addition, this time last year we began a Junior Summer Hockey Competition at Perth Hockey Stadium together with WASPS and Vic Park HC. This competition provides a fun atmosphere of mixed, small sided game formats for all ages, with High School age groups playing on Tuesday evenings and Primary School age groups playing on Thursday evenings. CUHC has submitted a team in all age groups since the competition began, and in Term 4 successfully filled 2x J5/6 teams.

I would like to personally thank all the members, coaches, parents, managers, players & volunteers who contributed to the junior division this year – without you, this work would not be possible. We are looking forward to a big 2022 season!
