President's Report

Season 2022 was the first time that we as a hockey community were faced with participating in a competition while COVID-19 transmission was live in the community.

In previous seasons we had seen competition start and stop around lockdowns, whereas this year saw Hockey WA publish a set of rules specifically aimed to see the season run while the virus was spreading in the community. This certainly presented its challenges with respect to weekly team selection and player availability; I'd like to thank you all, our membership, for your resilience and the patience shown throughout this season.

As a club, despite the covid effected seasons of the recent past, we managed to grow from last season, bringing on an additional women's metro side and bolstering our junior participation.

Of particular note, it was great to see us nominate both junior boys and girls in the 5/6 competition and deliver our own Minkey program for the first time in a number of years. Thanks to all our junior coaches and in particular to Amy and Lorraine for their hard work in this space.

From 16 senior teams, we had 4 senior sides make finals, 1 participating in a grand final, for 1 premiership – this is an improvement on finals participation from last season, but certainly an area of growth available to us. As a club I'd like to see us really continue to strive for excellence in the coming seasons.

This season we saw the development of our first indigenous playing uniform. The requirement for a premier league clash strip has been written into the competition rules for a number of years and is being mandated by Hockey WA from next season onwards. We took the opportunity to engage with long time club member and contemporary Noongar artist Jarni McGuire and develop the Navy uniform you will have seen our premier league playing in. As a committee we wanted the development of this to be more than a uniform and be a launching pad for us to start developing more tangible



reconciliation outcomes, and so as part of the uniform launch we were proud to release a club's Reconciliation Statement. It reads:

Curtin University Hockey Club are committed to reconciliation and strengthening respectful relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Reconciliation begins with actions in our daily lives; where we live, work, socialise and where we play our sport.

As part of this initiative part proceeds from our Supporter polo sales will be donated to an indigenous charity. We hope our membership is proud of the uniform and the position the club is taking with respect to reconciliation within our community and we thank Curtin University and the Town of Victoria Park for their contributions towards the artwork and the development of the uniform.

With the borders back open again, our Premier league sides were bolstered by the arrival of imports from interstate and overseas. This resulted in improved performance from our top sides, however the competitiveness of the premier league division in both genders continues to increase year on year.

I'd like to take a moment to thank all of those who assisted in providing accommodation and transport to the imports this season:

We made a conscious effort to celebrate our premier league milestones this season. No doubt you would have seen the coverage on our social media and Hockey WA's about the milestones of Tanya, Kate, Chani and Kirstie. We are keen to expand this to all our teams moving forward but will need some support from the membership to fill in the gaps in the available information from Hockey WA. So look out for RFI's from the committee to help us in this recognition space.

We again had members selected in State and National sides, from the under 21s through to the Over 70's and the Hockey One League. A full list of our representatives is available in this report.

The hockey calendar was punctuated by the Commonwealth Games and Women's World Cup, and we were lucky enough to have a healthy cohort of our own home-grown players and Hockey Australia draftees show their wares on the global stage. They were Kaitlin Nobbs, Penny Squibb, Greta Hayes and Meg Pearce. On the men's side we had the NSW pair of Dylan Martin and Ky Willott. While Ky and Dyl weren't part of the Commonwealth Games squad I know our Premier league men benefitted from their availability throughout the season.

As always, we managed to fill a wide variety of volunteer positions, so a special thank you to all those who not only chose to play hockey, but took on additional roles this year. In particular:

Curtin Liaison Report

Fields update

Stemming from feedback received from grass players at the 2021 AGM, we took it as a priority to improve our grass playing fields on Edinburgh South Oval, Curtin University. In early 2022, prior to the start of the 2022 Winter Season we met with Curtin Sport and Recreation staff to raise our concerns and work together to improve the surface. To Curtin Sport and Recreation's credit, they were very receptive to our feedback and worked with us to set up a more regular time line for line marking and mowing of the grounds throughout the season.

This year, Curtin University continued to use the space for outdoor events like Orientation Day, Open Day and Graduation Ceremonies. Unfortunately, following these types of events, the grounds were in quite poor condition and the club decided to approach the Vice Chancellor to raise our concerns higher in the university. CUHC President Tom Reid met with the Chief Operating Officer to raise the club's concerns. We agreed that where possible, Edinburgh South Oval will not be used for events during the regular winter season, and where it had to be used, marquees and tents are to be positioned on areas away from the playing field itself.

We continue to work with the university to improve the fields and are happy to see that the grounds are beginning to improve.

Storage Update

This year, I have been working toward re-gaining storage at Curtin Stadium or Perth Hockey Stadium. Space at PHS is limited, but thankfully, we have gained storage in the Sea Container at Edinburgh South Oval. This space is currently set up to storage junior equipment; however, there may be opportunity in the future to expand this for storage of senior equipment. CUHC has exclusive use of this container for 1 year, until October 2023.

Curtin University Student Sport Advisory Council

Curtin University has recently formed a Student Sport Advisory Council (CUSSAC) of which I am a founding member. The council consists of eight (8) students from a range of sporting backgrounds including social sports, clubs, representative sport and elite athletes. The formation of this council is a big step in the right direction to advocate for the importance of sport to the broader university experience for students. The key portfolios created by the council are:

- Elite Athletes
- Representative Sports
- Clubs
- Intramural (interfaculty & interhouse)
- Social Sports and Fitness
- Curtin Alumni Connection
- Uniform and Branding
- Marketing and Communications



I am currently the lead on the Clubs and Curtin Alumni Connection portfolios. This is a great opportunity for Curtin University students at the club who are passionate about sport on campus to get involved. We are always looking for potential new members to join projects of the council itself, please get in touch if this is something you would like to do.

Membership and Recruitment Director's Report

2022 was a fantastic growth year for the club with memberships at 382 up from 2021's recorded 318 registrations showing a fantastic growth year for the club. The club memberships percentages can be seen in the table below with still a strong proportion of student members and a growing junior presence at the club.

Again, we had some strong interest from university students with many enquiries about the club as well as university sport. We had a large number of our student members representing the university in both women's and men's teams continuing our strong connection with Curtin and achieving the best Curtin finish with a 5th place division 1 women's and gold medal division 1's men's. As usual Curtin was glad of our support, and we also have had a number of students from other clubs at various levels interested in joining Curtin next year.

We proposed an "Into the Future" plan last year focusing on premier league recruitment with a focus on finding coaches willing to stay multiple seasons and with a drive to push our top squads to perform better. This was successful in finding committed coaches with positive feedback from the squads for the head coaches on both sides of the club on their coaching styles and performance for the year.

Curtin Affiliation Recommendations:

- Tavern events are a good fundraiser as well as getting the Pirates club name out maybe try to build a student fanbase with such an event
- Physiotherapy: Students are always looking to get experience for next season we need to use this resource; along with Exercise Physiologists at Curtin
- Using University games as a recruitment/advertisement of the club by increasing and maintaining our support

Club Recommendations:

- **Junior Team Ambassadors:**
 - Premier league Players attending some games and trainings to build a senior-junior connection



- **Summer camp**
 - Building on creating a connection for juniors to seniors it has been expressed by some members of a summer camp for junior talent/all talent to develop and provide opportunities to develop for our members
 - This provides better club unity and a more friendly club all round with the added bonus of developing youth for high level hockey in their future
- **Umpire Mentoring Programs**
 - **Junior's (and seniors in future) allocated to Senior's to watch and help umpire**
 - The learner umpire gets paired up with an experienced mentor
 - The experienced mentor umpires JUNIOR matches on either Saturday or Sunday morning with the learner running alongside.
 - After 3-4 matches observing, roles reverse & the learner blows the whistle with the mentor running alongside
 - Once comfortable, the mentor eventually sits on the sideline observing & giving advice in the breaks.
 - Ultimately leading to the completion of their Umpiring level 1
- **Indoor Hockey**
 - Look into indoor hockey and supporting a team to expand the club playing options

Teams Director's Report

Due to covid hitting us for the first time and players being able to travel after many years, our player depth was severely tested. This was probably one of the most difficult years I have ever encountered, spending hours and hours each week trying to find players.

Many teams throughout the season, especially on the women's side, were very depleted from Prem 1s down to div 9, sometimes having to play with 11 or less players.

What a great year, 2022!

Thank you to every one of you for working hard just so teams could play games. This year we welcomed the metro team (grass) back to the club and what a success it was! We had 8 teams with several new players welcomed to the club.



All teams displayed promising development and commitment. This year all teams were moved up a grade which gave many players the opportunity for skill development in an exciting atmosphere for friendships with new and returning players.

We congratulated Greta Hayes, Meg Pearce, Penny Squibb and Kaitlin Knobbs who represented Australia at the international level, and not to forget this year Sarah Byrnes, Kate Denning and Penny Squibb represented CUHC in the Perth Thundersticks. Ana Cana also participating in the U18's National Tournament, congrats.

Our Premier 1 team overall achieved 5 wins and 3 draws for the season. The Premier 2's finished the season with 1 win and 1 draws. It was a tough year for our Premier 1's and 2's finishing outside the finals in 7th and 10th place, respectively.

It was a thrill to watch the Women's Metro and Master's team throughout the season. The Metro team progressed through to semi and preliminary finals.
